

Four Square Writing Method

The Four Square Writing Method is a simple yet effective organizational technique that helps students plan and structure their writing. Here's a quick overview:

1. Central Topic:

Students begin by writing their main idea or topic in the center square of a four-square graphic organizer.

2. Supporting Details:

In the top three squares, students add three supporting details or arguments related to the main topic.

3. Conclusion:

The bottom right square is used for the conclusion, which often restates the main idea.

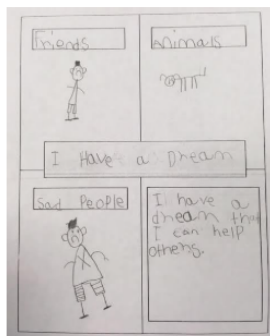
4. Transition Words:

Students add transition words in the corners of each square to improve flow between ideas.

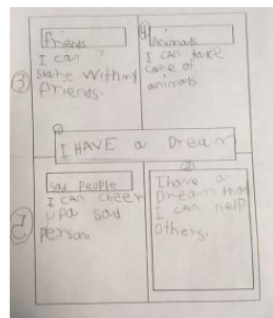
5. Elaboration:
